

The Library is excited to welcome students back! Our library and book borrowing will begin on Tuesday, September 15.

École Arthur Pechey Public School Library is full of wonderful reading choices for our students and classrooms! We are excited to offer selections for students to read and enjoy as they return to the building and our school community.

The following information describes how library borrowing will proceed:

- The Kindergarten to Grade 3 Classes will have the library come to them alternate weeks.
- Grades 4 to 8 classes will come to the library for a quick book exchange, browsing the books put on display for their group specifically - with their eyes only - and then return to class.

The borrowing period will be 2 weeks instead of 1 week and students will be allowed to borrow 4 books at a time.

- Students may return books to the library return bin for that day. The returns will be signed in and reside in that day's return bin, to sit for 72 hours before going back into circulation.
- Hand sanitizer will be required before entering the library and students will select books from DISPLAY ITEMS ONLY – books that they can see the cover. (Look with eyes first and use hands ONLY when picking the book they will check out from the library).
- Books can go home with students and upon return to the building MUST be placed in the return bin to be quarantined.

SCHOOL ACTIVITY FEE

If you have not paid your child's School Activity Fees please do so at the office.

Kindergarten students pay \$10 and students in Grades 1-8 pay an annual fee of \$20.00. This money is used to cover a wide range of expenses such as outdoor education and extra consumable items necessary to support your child's classroom. It is sometimes necessary to charge an additional nominal fee to cover extra field trips or special project costs. We will try to minimize extra costs as much as possible.

<u>Tipi Teachings – A Character and Values Education Program</u>

At École Arthur Pechey Public School, we believe that schools have the opportunity and the responsibility to "build student capacity for intercultural understanding, empathy, and mutual respect," (Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada, Call to Action 63.3). We believe that the role of the school is not only to help students reach their academic but also their human potential. The Tipi Teachings is the Character and Values Education program we use, as a school, to drive this.

The Tipi Teachings model that we follow includes 15 teachings, including one value for each of 13 poles. In all, there are 15 teachings that hold up the tipi. Over the course of the school year, we focus as a school on a new teaching every two weeks. These teachings include values such as Respect, Humility, Happiness, Thankfulness, Sharing, Strength, and Hope: values that are common to all of us. Every morning, classes begin the day reflecting on, discussing, or actively engaging in the current teaching or value.

Over the course of the year, we use the Tipi Teachings model to teach our students about empathy, courage, and kindness, about how to develop successful friendships and establish positive lifelong relationships based on intercultural understanding and mutual respect. Through the teachings, the students are taught to care for and respect themselves, their families and peers, and their community. Together we are creating a place of hope, optimism, and gratitude in which everyone who walks in our building feels a genuine sense of belonging (Kevin Lamoureux).

Over the course of the year please check our bulletin board by the gym for more information about the Tipi Teachings and what we are currently focused on as a school. If you have any questions, want to know more, or want to get involved in our efforts to provide authentic learning experiences for our students, please don't hesitate to reach out to the staff of École Arthur Pechey Public School. Our relationship and partnership with you, our school community, is integral to our continued success in providing the best possible education for our children.


Orange Shirt Day

School Board Election Monday, November 9, 2020

SASKATCHEWAN RIVERS PUBLIC SCHOOL DIVISION NO. 119

The school division is divided into ONE (1) CITY SUBDIVISION in which FIVE (5) BOARD MEMBERS are to be elected and FIVE (5) RURAL SUBDIVISIONS in which ONE (1) BOARD MEMBER from each subdivision is to be elected.

Qualifications of Candidates....

A person is eligible to be nominated as a candidate for and hold office as a **BOARD MEMBER** for a school division if the person:

- (a) is an voter of the school division on the day of the election;
- (b) is a Canadian citizen at the time he or she submits his or her nomination paper; and
- (c) has resided:

A candidate may choose to run in the IN-CITY SUBDIVISION AREA or ONE of the FIVE OUT-OF-CITY AREAS of the school division, regardless of his or her

residency in the division; however, he or she must obtain signatures of voters of only that subdivision area in which he or she intends to run.

A person may be nominated as a candidate for election by filing a nomination paper in the prescribed form, signed by ten voters residing in the subdivision in which he or she intends to run.

Nominations will be received by election officials during regular office hours from September 21 until October 6 and on Nomination Day, Wednesday, the 7th day of October, 2020 from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. at the following locations:

Rural Subdivisions at the Education Centre, Saskatchewan Rivers Public School Division No. 119, 545 – 11th Street East, Prince Albert, Saskatchewan S6V 1B1 (regular office hours are 8:00 a.m. until noon and 1:00 p.m. – 4:30 p.m.)

In-City Subdivisions at the City of Prince Albert, 1084 Central Avenue, Prince Albert S6V 7P3 (regular office hours are 8:00 a.m. – 4:45 p.m.)

Nomination papers may be submitted personally or by agent by personal service, by registered mail, by ordinary mail, by fax,

by email or as otherwise specified by the returning officer and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 or by a certified cheque

or money order in that amount made payable to the Saskatchewan Rivers Public School Division.
