Keeping our School Community Safe!

We are so happy to welcome our students and staff back this school year. We continue to work hard to create a safe and joyful environment at Arthur Pechey. - We appreciate your efforts in monitoring your children and keeping them home
 if they are sick. If your child is not feeling well or is exhibiting symptoms of
 COVID-19 or if the number of symptoms they have is increasing or the symptoms
 are getting worse, please call 811 and follow the direction of SHA.
- Mask wearing: All students, Pre-K to Grade 8, as well as staff, are required to wear masks while indoors during the school day with some exceptions in Physical Education and Band.
- All students will wear a mask while riding the school bus or while being transported during the school day.
- Recesses and lunch will be staggered so that there will only ever be half or fewer
 of the students accessing the equipment and using the entrances.
- Students are asked to only bring to school what they require such as a lunch kit, backpack, and water bottle.
- Rather than water fountains, we have three bottle filling stations. Please ensure your child has a water bottle to use at school.
- Continuation of increased cleaning and sanitization of the school facility
- Continued promotion and education on hand washing and sanitizing.

SCHOOL ACTIVITY FEE

If you have not paid your child's School Activity Fees please do using the new online payment option or you may pay in person at the office. There will be a service fee for online payments. Kindergarten students pay \$10.75 and students in Grades 1-8 pay an annual fee of \$21.00. This money is used to cover a wide range of expenses such as guest presentations, outdoor education, and extra consumable items used each year to support your child's classroom. It is sometimes necessary to charge an additional nominal fee to cover extra field trips or special project costs. We will try to minimize extra costs as much as possible.

<u>Tipi Teachings - A Character and Values Education Program</u>

At École Arthur Pechey Public School, we believe that schools have the opportunity and the responsibility to "build student capacity for intercultural understanding, empathy, and mutual respect," (Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada, Call to Action 63.3). We believe that the role of the school is not only to help students reach their academic but also their human potential. The Tipi Teachings is the Character and Values Education program we use, as a school, to drive this.

The Tipi Teachings model that we follow includes 15 teachings, including one value for each of 13 poles. In all, there are 15 teachings that hold up the tipi. Over the course of the school year, we focus as a school on a new teaching every two weeks. These teachings include values such as Respect, Humility, Happiness, Thankfulness, Sharing, Strength, and Hope: values that are common to all of us. Every morning, classes begin the day reflecting on, discussing, or actively engaging in the current teaching or value.

Over the course of the year, we use the Tipi Teachings model to teach our students about empathy, courage, and kindness, about how to develop successful friendships and establish positive lifelong relationships based on intercultural understanding and mutual respect. Through the teachings, the students are taught to care for and respect themselves, their families and peers, and their community. Together we are creating a place of hope, optimism, and gratitude in which everyone who walks in our building feels a genuine sense of belonging (Kevin Lamoureux).

Over the course of the year please check our bulletin board by the gym for more information about the Tipi Teachings and what we are currently focused on as a school. 
School Community Council

Kindergarten students will use a pre-order form and have access on their attendance days.



Students have the opportunity to purchase a canteen card. Students can bring any amount of money to put on their card. The card would be kept in the canteen and students would order and we would deduct the money as they spend. Parents can also set a daily spending limit. Money can be sent and added at anytime to the student canteen card. This is a great option as students wouldn't have to carry money everyday they are going to purchase from the canteen.

Important Information about Busing

Registering your child for busing is necessary, but not every year. Please only re-register if the student's information has changed. This may include a change of school, address or contact information.

Busing

Our bus zone is on 28th Street and there is now 15-minute loading as well as a section for two hour parking 26th Street West. We ask you to be aware of the parking signage when dropping off, picking up or parking to enter the school. As always, we would like to remind you that the staff parking lot is not available for drop off or pick up of students.



AP Athletics



We are so excited to have our extra-curricular sports starting up again this year, beginning at Phase 4 of the SRPSD Re-Entry Plan. The plan allows for spectators, following masking procedures and signing in for contact tracing. At AP, due to the size of our gym, we will be allowing 2 spectators per athlete to allow for appropriate social distancing during our indoor sporting events.
